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3. Minimum scores may vary according to individual programs.

Academic Requirements

1. Documents must be official and sent from the granting institution. Documents sent by email or facsimile, or documents that have been notarized or attested will not be accepted. Documents must be accompanied by a notarized English language translation as required.
2. A list of acceptable academic admission requirements for international students shall be established and maintained by Enrolment Services. Specific programs may have additional admission requirements (for more information regarding specific program admission requirements please see the UCN Calendar).

Criteria for English Language Proficiency Waivers

Under certain circumstances an applicant may request a waiver of the English language proficiency requirement. They will need to provide supporting documentation to show that they meet one of the following conditions to receive the waiver:

1. Ten consecutive years of residency in Canada that may include years of study in Canada. The period of residency will be the time elapsed between the "Landed On" date and on the "Record of Landing" document and the start of the program.
2. Successful completion of secondary studies equates to meeting the entrance requirements of the University College of the North. Secondary education must include Grade 12 where appropriate.
3. Successful completion of post-secondary education equates to a minimum completion of 30 credit hours or equivalent.
4. Graduation from a Manitoba high school, with five credits at the Grade 12 level, which include one credit of English at the Grade 12 level with an average grade of 60%. Mature high school diploma with an overall average of 60% which includes one credit of English at the grade 12 level.
5. Graduation from a Canadian Curriculum secondary school (other than Manitoba curriculum) with a Grade 12 English grade of 60%
6. International Baccalaureate Higher Level English course, or a grade of four or greater on the Advanced Placement English examination (Language composition; Literature and Composition).
7. Successful completion of one university transferrable English course at least the 1000 level or year 1 with a minimum grade C.

Additionally, applicants will receive the waiver if they verify conditions equivalent to 1, 2 or 3 listed above in a country where English is the primary language.
