The Position: Reporting to the Associate Vice President, Access, instructors are responsible for the development and delivery of high school credit courses including the evaluation of student performance, following provincial curriculum frameworks. Where applicable, instructors will also coordinate and assess student-initiated projects including cultural exploration, volunteer work experience and/or credit for employment. Instructors assist with student recruitment, assessment and registration and support the administrative functions of the ALC program, including statistical reporting and learner analysis surveys.

Qualifications:

- A Bachelor of Education Degree with a valid Manitoba Teaching Certificate
- Recent experience teaching high school courses such as: Mathematics, English Language Arts, Computers and/or Science
- Demonstrated understanding and experience using provincial curriculum frameworks
- Previous experience working with indigenous and northern learners
- Understanding of Cultural Influences and specific issues facing adult learners in northern Manitoba
- Strong personal computer skills
- Excellent communication skills
- Effective interpersonal skills
- Effective organizational and time management skills
- Demonstrated ability to understand and to deal with issues specific to indigenous learners and mature students in northern communities
- Experience and/or knowledge and understanding of Indigenous cultures

Assets:

- Previous experience teaching adults
- The ability to speak an Indigenous language
- Certificate in Adult Education or comparable education
- A minimum of five years teaching experience, ideally at the high school or adult education level
- Knowledge and experience with learning technologies in a college or university setting

Conditions of Employment:

- Candidates must be legally entitled to work in Canada
- Candidates must provide an acceptable Criminal Record Check and Child Abuse Registry
- Must be able to accommodate a flexible delivery schedule – day, evening, and distance learning courses

Applicants must provide a cover letter, résumé, references and copies of their transcripts with their application.

Applicants must demonstrate on their résumé how they meet the qualifications.

Representative Workforce is a factor in the selection process. Preference will be given to Indigenous candidates. Applicants are invited to indicate in their covering letter or resume if they are from any of the following groups: Indigenous people, persons with disabilities, visible minorities, or women and men in non-traditional roles. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.
