**Basic First Aid Training:** This 1-day course is taught using face-to-face delivery of St. John Ambulance curriculum. The primary focus is CPR Level C (adult/infant/child), AED (defibrillator), and emergency situations.

**Intermediate First Aid Training:** This 2-day course is taught using face-to-face delivery of St. John Ambulance curriculum and includes CPR Level C (adult/infant/child), AED, with more thorough coverage of first aid situations.
