Course Cost: Basic First Aid is \$126 (\$120 + \$6 GST), Intermediate First Aid is \$194.25 (\$185 + \$9.25 GST), per person payable to UCN at time of registration.

Basic First Aid Training (EXT.0070): This 1-day course is taught using face-to-face delivery of St. John Ambulance curriculum. The primary focus is CPR Level C (adult/infant/child), AED (defibrillator), and emergency situations.

Intermediate First Aid Training (EXT.0158): This 2-day course is taught using face-to-face delivery of St. John Ambulance curriculum and includes CPR Level C (adult/infant/child), AED, with more thorough coverage of first aid situations.
