DUTIES

University College of the North (UCN) requires a University Instructor to teach into the Aboriginal and Northern Studies program at the Thompson Campus. Reporting to the Dean of the Faculty of Arts, Business, and Science, instructors are responsible for the development and delivery of culturally relevant curriculum, instructional practices, and assessment methods. In addition to teaching duties, the instructor will be responsible for related duties including classroom management, student supervision, maintenance of student records and grades, curriculum refinement, and other administrative activities.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS

- Master's degree in Aboriginal/Northern Studies and/or relevant combination of education and experience may be considered
- Ability to speak the Cree language fluently
- Experience in both oratory and linguistic approaches to Cree language instruction
- Demonstrated creative and culturally relevant instructional practices with adults and Indigenous learners
- Effective communication skills and interpersonal skills
- Strong organizational skills
- Strong critical thinking and leadership skills
- Experience teaching in an online/virtual environment using various Learning Management Systems (Adobe, Zoom, D2L, etc.)
- Demonstrated ability to understand and deal with issues specific to Indigenous learners and mature students in northern Manitoba
- Experience and/or knowledge and understanding of Indigenous cultures

ASSETS

- Demonstrated experience teaching Indigenous and adult learners at the post-secondary level

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

- Candidates must be legally entitled to work in Canada
- Candidates must have a valid driver's license

Applicants are asked to provide a cover letter, resume and three references with their application. Applicants must demonstrate in their cover letter and their resume how they meet the qualifications.

UCN is committed to building a workforce representative of the populations we serve. Preference will be given to qualified Indigenous candidates. Applicants are invited to indicate in their cover letter or resume if they are from any of the following groups: Indigenous peoples, persons with disabilities, visible minorities, or women and men in non-traditional roles. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.
