Location: UCN-OCN Training Centre, Otineka Mall - Opaskwayak, MB
Face to Face delivery unless Covid guidelines require classes to be moved to remote learning

Dates: April 4-22, 2022 Essential Skills and Upgrading (delivered through Workplace Education MB {WEM})
April 25, 2022-January 13, 2023 UCN Home Builder Program

Cost: No cost to student (partially funded by OCN E & T)
Students will be required to provide steel toed boots, and may require a laptop with video, microphone and reliable internet in the event classes are moved to remote learning.

The Home Builder Certificate program allows learners to gain residential construction industry-ready skills to build homes in a timely, simple and cost-effective manner using common building practices. Educators, partners and industry stakeholders give the opportunity to not only build a home, but ultimately gain exposure to the many trades and career paths associated with the residential construction industry in the home building process. The program provides hands-on exposure to home building plus theory, skills and safety training needed to work in the residential construction field.

Admission Requirements: Completed Grade 10 with Math, Science and English | Or Mature Student (assessment required) | Preference will be given to **Indigenous women** who meet these requirements.

All students must be fully vaccinated to attend training. Proof of vaccination will be required to enter all UCN facilities. Masks are mandatory. As guidelines change, students will be notified.
