Location

Learning will take place at Guy Hill. Guy Hill is the site of a former Indian Residential School. However, the site is now overseen by Opaskawayak Cree Nation and has become a place for ceremony, celebration and healing.

Chancellor Edwin Jebb will provide an introduction and overview of the area.

• Guy Hill is located adjacent to Clearwater Lake and is approximately 35 kilometers northeast of The Pas.

Directions from The Pas to Guy Hill:

- Travel north on Highway 10 for approximately 20 kilometers
- Turn right onto Highway 287 (entrance to Clearwater Provincial Park) and travel approximately 13 kilometers.
- Turn left onto a gravel road approximately 2 kilometers past the airport (a sign will be posted at the corner). The gravel road ends at Guy Hill

Transportation

Staff and faculty will be responsible to provide their own transportation to the site. Drivers who bring a minimum of 3 passengers to Guy Hill will receive \$20.00 to cover fuel costs.

Food and Drinks

Lunch and light snacks will be provided. Participants are also welcome to bring their personal coffee, tea, snacks, etc.

What to wear

Dress warmly! Consider dressing in layers. The site is often windy and cool. Toques and mittens are a good idea. Keep in mind that your footwear may get dirty as you will be outdoors in a grassy area.
