The **MB Security Guard Training** (LEP 0184.SR.41) is certified through MB Justice. The training includes all materials and the provincial exam fee. Upon successful completion of the provincial exam, participants will be able to apply separately for the MB Security Guard License at their own expense.

Participants must meet the minimum age requirement of 18 by program commencement – proof of age required. Participants will be required to provide a Criminal Records Check (including Vulnerable Sector Screening) and Child Abuse Registry Check in order to apply for the MB Security Guard License.
