DESCRIPTION:

- ✓ **Small Vessel Operator Proficiency** (EXT.1242) is four-day course designed to cover the minimum training of operators of commercial vessels, up to 5 gross tonnage engaged on a near coastal, class 2 or a sheltered waters voyage, and for fishing vessels up to 15 gross tonnage or 12 meters overall length engaged on a near coastal, class 2 or a sheltered waters voyage.
- ✓ **Small Domestic Vessel-Basic Safety** (EXT.1243) is a one-day course designed to cover basic safety training for crew members of non-pleasure vessels of not more than 150 gross tonnage operating not more than 25 nautical miles from shore.
